Sherbrooke Village Old Fashioned Christmas to Take a Pause for Thoughtful Reflection in 2024

Sherbrooke Village Old Fashioned Christmas Association (SVOFCA) has deemed it necessary to cancel the 2024 edition of the Old-Fashioned Christmas event.

Shifting community demographics and volunteer burnout have contributed to this difficult decision by SVOFCA. At the same time, Sherbrooke Village recognises the community importance of the Old-Fashioned Christmas event to residents, families, businesses and visitors to the District of St. Mary's. After taking a pause this year for thoughtful reflection on the best path forward, Sherbrooke Village currently anticipates launching a renewed holiday event on the Museum site next year.

Old Fashioned Christmas at Sherbrooke Village has been an annual tradition since 1996, with hiatus years in 2008 and 2014.

Sherbrooke Village and Sherbrooke Restoration Commission are committed to expanding community use and novel events on the Museum site throughout the year, and in the off-season, and look forward to a revitalised holiday event in November 2025.
